THE READINGS

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS 21:15-26

After these days we got ready and started to go up to Jerusalem. Some of the disciples from Caesarea also came along and brought us to the house of Mnason of Cyprus, an early disciple, with whom we were to stay. When we arrived in Jerusalem, the brothers welcomed us warmly. The next day Paul went with us to visit James; and all the elders were present.

After greeting them, he related one by one the things that God had done among the Gentiles through his ministry. When they heard it, they praised God. Then they said to him, 'You see, brother, how many thousands of believers there are among the Jews, and they are all zealous for the law. They have been told about you that you teach all the Jews living among the Gentiles to forsake Moses, and that you tell them not to circumcise their children or observe the customs.

What then is to be done? They will certainly hear that you have come. So do what we tell you. We have four men who are under a vow. Join these men, go through the rite of purification with them, and pay for the shaving of their heads. Thus, all will know that there is nothing in what they have been told about you, but that you yourself observe and guard the law.

But as for the Gentiles who have become believers, we have sent a letter with our judgement that they should abstain from what has been sacrificed to idols and from blood and from what is strangled^[a] and from fornication.' Then Paul took the men, and the next day, having purified himself, he entered the temple with them, making public the completion of the days of purification when the sacrifice would be made for each of them.

GOSPEL: Mark 10:17-31

THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO MARK

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother.""

He said to him, 'Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.' Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, 'How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!' And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, 'Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.' They were greatly astounded and said to one another, 'Then who can be saved?' Jesus looked at them and said, 'For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.'

Peter began to say to him, 'Look, we have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.'

The Gospel of Christ.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

SERMON

Jesus says, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." This is a familiar saying. And we can overlook the challenge and the divine promise. For the love of God, we get everything when we give everything away.

It's a hard lesson for everyone if we consider: what does Jesus mean by "rich"? We can be rich in money and objects – like the young ruler. And we can be rich in other ways – like the disciples. We've got riches in talent, health, ability, time, and social esteem. We've all got gifts. And we can keep them to ourselves. We can horde our treasure. The good news is that we can give our riches away – spend them on others – for the love of God and each other. What's good about this?

Ultimate freedom. We get salvation. Jesus Christ makes this possible. He gives everything away – even his life – for the love of the world. And God resurrects and restores. And more than this, God generates more life and gifts than we can ask or imagine. The gift of salvation is a release from all the ties that bind us and prevent us from being with God in love and truth and beauty. What often holds us back are variations of ego desires: "I want this thing...I want to control that...I want to own more." The ego drives greed, jealousy, and hunger for power and control. We can forget who the true ruler of the world is.

Here and now, this world is God's Kingdom. Everything is part of God's story. We are actors in God's drama. We can forget this and try to take the lead. But the star actor is Jesus Christ. By following him, we learn the way to act in God's story. And today, Jesus says to give all we got for the love of God and each other. The biggest hurdle is often the fear of losing – the fear of giving up our riches.

We're not alone. The rich young ruler is "shocked" and he "grieves." He walks away. He can't follow. This way is too hard – giving it all up. The disciples are "astounded." They wonder, "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus is compassionate. He is quick to tell the disciples that: "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible." For Jesus Christ, God's Word made flesh – giving everything up for the love of all is possible. And he makes it possible for us. It takes God's help. And we also have each other. In Christ, in the world here and now, we have billions of sisters, brothers, mothers, and fathers.

Jesus understands that we can hold back, even if it hurts us. When he looks at the rich young ruler, we are told that Jesus "loved him." This hard teaching is not meant to hurt or to destroy the rich. It's meant to tell everyone what is necessary for salvation: that is, being free from all that stops us from embracing the way of love and trust in God.

Most of us are not considered wealthy rulers. We're like the disciples. We've got a portion of things and we work in the community. The disciples left everything to follow Jesus. And the rich young ruler could not. Is there something in between?

The disciples *left* everything, but did they *give* everything? Peter will deny Jesus during his trial and execution. At this time, Peter does not *give* his trust or his voice to God. He walks away in fear at the greatest hour of Jesus' need. But Peter will also repent, turn back to God, recommit himself, and become the rock of the church. Like the disciples, we're always learning to be freer, more giving, and more loving with God and each other. And, the good news is that, in Jesus, God makes this journey of salvation possible.
